COME TO JESUS

John 5:31–47 Key Verses: 5:39–40

- 1. What has Jesus been saying about himself (5:17–18, 21–23, 26–27)? Why was this hard for the Jews to accept? Read verses 31–35. Why was John the Baptist such a valid witness (1:6–7)? Review how he had testified about Jesus (1:29; 3:31–36).
- 2. Read verse 36. What were the "works" Jesus was doing (1–9a)? Why was it such clear evidence that the Father had sent him (21)? Why are a person's works just as important as his words (Mt7:15–20)?
- 3. How has the Father himself testified about Jesus (37a,39,46; cf. 1:31–34)? Read verses 37–38. For what did Jesus rebuke them? Why were they so ignorant of God? What does it mean to have God's word "abide" in us?
- 4. Read verses 39–40. What wrong idea about Scripture study did the Jews have (cf. Ro2:17–18)? What does it mean to "come" to Jesus (3:20–21)? What can we learn here about how and why we should study the Bible?
- 5. Read verses 41–44. Note the contrast here between human glory and God's love; how are they mutually exclusive? What was hindering the Jews from accepting Jesus?
- 6. Read verses 45–47. How had Moses testified about Jesus (e.g. Ge3:15; 12:3; 49:10; Ex12:7,13; Nu24:17; Dt18:15)? How did these Jews respond to these things (47)? What was their problem?
- 7. Review all the witnesses to Jesus mentioned here. Why do we need to believe in Jesus based on valid testimony?
