JESUS CHOSE HIS TWELVE DISCIPLES

Luke 6:12-26

Key Verse: 6:13, "When morning came, he called his disciples to him and chose twelve of them, whom he also designated apostles:"

- 1. What was the spiritual and social environment of those days (12a; 6:2,11)? What did Jesus do amidst that situation (12b)? Why did Jesus choose his twelve disciples (13a)? What is the significance of designating them apostles (13b)?
- 2. Who are the Twelve (14-16)? What factors are common and how are they different? Why might Jesus choose such a diverse group? Why did Jesus change Simon's name to Peter?
- 3. When Jesus went down with his disciples and stood on a level place, who were there and why (17-18a)? How was the power of Jesus manifested (18b-19)?
- 4. On whom did Jesus focus his teachings (20a)? Who are the blessed in Luke's gospel and why (20b-23, cf. Mt 5:3-12)? How can you be more blessed as a disciple of Jesus?
- 5. For whom are woes reserved and why (24-26)? How is this different from the world's view? What can we learn about the value system Jesus wants his disciples to have?
