

A Note on using these materials



The Old Testament studies cover a wide range of chapters, so you probably won't have time to read entire passages but rather a summary of the passage. The

passages covered in the summary are in the upper left hand corner. Children should be encouraged to read the passage at home with their parents. In the upper right hand corner is a key verse which the children can learn or memorize.





On the second page there is a think about it section and a talk about its section. The think about it section summarizes

think about it section summarizes the main points of the Bible passage

and serves as a teacher's guide. The Talk About It questions don't cover every minute detail of the passage but encourage discussion of the main spiritual points. The bolded, underlined questions are questions that don't have a specific answer from the passage but can be discussed giving everyone a chance to give their input. These questions are the focus of the study and the Think About It section gives some guide to answering these questions.






The next page lists around 8 questions for group discussion. The teacher can use these questions to talk with the class about topics that relate the passage to their life so they can get talking and thinking about the application of the passage and have some discussion time.

write one thing they learned and one way they can apply it. This is to assist in testimony writing, since over the course of the week, they often forget the main point of what they learned when they go to write. The testimony section, consists of a brief section for summarizing what they learned and a much longer section describing how they put it into practice or repented this week.

Finally, there's an activity at the end of the lesson. It's good to have fun time to build relationships in the class between each other and the teacher.

Preface

"And Jesus grew in wisdom and stature and favor with God and men." -Luke 2:52

Though there are not many verses mentioned about Jesus' childhood in the Bible, Luke 2:52 shows that Jesus is the role model of our children's education. Jesus was fully man and fully the beloved only Son of God. Boy Jesus was favored by God and men while he was growing in wisdom and stature. We want to know how our children can also be favored by God and men.

In 1994, Chicago CBF formed the curriculum team to serve children's spiritual growth and published two book: one Old Testament and one New Testament. In 2006 we formed the second curriculum team, among teachers who have been serving CBF for more than five years. At the onset we set three goals: 1) to comprehensively teach the Bible in full 2) to assist teachers 3) to help children put the Bible into practice. With these, we gathered together every month for 5 years, prayed and developed 8 books of Bible study materials by grade covering the entire Bible over 8 years.

It was necessary and very fulfilling to make our own materials even though there are so many Bible study materials in the bookstores. We have a special mission and unique task to provide materials which deeply study the Bible for application among CBF children. We know that these books are not perfect. But we believe that God will accept our prayers and labor and use it for raising missionaries and Bible teachers in this generation.

So God made food for all the animals and people to eat. This was the third day.



to measure years. This was the fourth day.


Then God said, "let the water be filled with living things and birds fly across the sky." So animals filled the water and the air—only one place left to fill.



Theme: We are very good, Mission

"God saw all that he had made, and it was very good."

n six days God made everything on the earth: light, air to breath, land to walk on, plants to eat, birds, fish and all the animals. Now that everything was ready, it was time to make his most important creation: us!


Adam was so happy when he saw the woman, he made a poem about



Then Eve thought she would get in big trouble so she blamed the snake.


God was not happy. When we do something wrong he wants us to say what we did wrong and say we're sorry.

"If you do what is right, will you not be accepted? But if you do not do what is right, sin is crouching at your door; it desires to have you, but you must rule over it."


Finally, he killed his own brother! God gave him a chance to repent, he asked him "where is your




everything would die but he didn't ask questions, he got right to work. Noah listened to God well and obeyed everything he was told by God. This is why God was pleased with him.

Noah and his sons worked 120 years to build this


boat! Noah's neighbors and people he didn't know must have laughed and laughed. Who would build a boat in the middle of a desert? But Noah never stopped.

"But God remembered Noah and all the wild animals and the livestock that were with him in the ark."




respect them no matter what, so a curse was put on Ham's family.




God knew that if they could do this, they would forget about Him. Soon they would have advanced cities and lots of stuff and forget all about him.



Genesis 12:1-13:4

Theme: Trusting the promises of God, Obedience

fter God had stopped the building of the great tower in Babel people began to spread into the whole world. Soon the earth was filled with people living in many lands and speaking many languages.

Close to the city of Babylon was another city

called Ur. The people of Ur prayed to little stone or wooden statues called idols, and not to the one true God.

Abram had no idea where God would take him or what God's blessing meant, but he did what God said. He took all his tents, his flocks of sheep and cattle, and everything he owned. His wife, his brother and nephew, whose name was Lot, went with him. The family traveled to the land of Canaan (now called Israel). There were cities and towns there but Abram and his family were shepherds. They lived

outside the cities in their tents.

After a while of living in the land they had a hard time finding food for their sheep and themselves. Instead of trusting God, he moved to Egypt. But there everything went wrong. He lied to Pharaoh and got into big trouble and was kicked out. Abram went back to Canaan and built an altar to God and began to trust him and live for him from then on.


Abraham and Lot enter into Land Negotiations.

Genesis 14:1-24

Theme: Living for God not the world

fter leaving Abram Lot eventually moved to the city of Sodom the most wicked city in all Canaan. A war started there between the kings of the plain and the stronger kings who ruled them. It was a huge war of four kings against five and Sodom and the other cities

of the plain lost.

In those days the winner of a war everything won the loser owned: money, flocks of sheep, and even people. Lot and his family were captured and taken away from Sodom by the winning king.

As soon as Abram heard about this, he took his people and chased the

army that had captured Lot. With only three hundred and eighteen men he beat all four kings in battle. Now everything belonged to Abram!

The king of Salem (later Jerusalem), Melchizedek, came to see Abram. His name meant king of

righteousness and peace and he was priest of God most high.




He ate with Abram and helped him thank God and not be proud. Abram was very glad and gave him ten percent of the riches as an offering.

Then the king of Sodom came to Abram and offered that Abram keep all the money for himself and give him the people.

Abram refused to take anything for himself, because he didn't want anyone to take credit for making him rich but God. All he wanted was for Lot to be free. Once that was done, Abram went back to his home. Lot, however, went back to the wicked city of Sodom.

When the food was ready she dressed Jacob in Esau's rough clothes. Then she put the skin from


the goats over his neck and hands and Jacob took the food to his father.

fought but prayed. In the end the most powerful ruler came and believed in God because of Isaac. Isaac's life of peace and prayer were more powerful than any army.




So Tamar tricked







uring the seven good years Joseph collected one bushel of grain out of every five bushels the people had left

over. Soon he had so much food stored away that

no one could count it all. Joseph also married and had two sons.

Soon the seven good years passed. The people of Egypt ate up all the food they had saved in their own homes. When that was gone, they bought from the supply Joseph had saved up. Thanks to Joseph, there was plenty of food for everyone.

The famine hit other countries besides Egypt. Even Canaan was running out of food and Joseph's father Jacob had no grain to feed his large family. Hearing there was food in

Egypt, Jacob sent his ten older sons there with money. He kept his youngest son, Benjamin, home with him.

Joseph was now almost forty years old. He had been in Egypt for nearly twenty-three years. When his brothers came to him to buy food, they did not know who he was. He was dressed like a prince and sitting on a throne.

"No," they said, "we're just a poor family coming to buy food."


They told Joseph about his father and brother Benjamin and about the other son who was lost years ago (Joseph). Joseph pretended not to believe them and sent them to prison for three days.





W

hile his servants were putting grain in sacks for his brothers, Joseph gave them a strange

order. "Put each man's money back in the sacks."

When his brothers found the money later, they were frightened. Someone might say they had stolen the grain! They explained everything to Jacob but he wouldn't let them take Benjamin.

The food the brothers brought from Egypt soon ran out. Jacob finally agreed that Benjamin could go. When Joseph saw Benjamin he told his servant to prepare a

meal. The brothers were treated as honored guests.

When it was time to eat Joseph had them sit at the table in order of their ages, with the oldest brother closest to him. How did he know their ages? the brothers wondered. Joseph also saw that Benjamin, the youngest, got five times as much food as his brothers.

After dinner Joseph told his servants to fill the

"The rest of you may go," Joseph said. "But the thief must stay." Would his



ow that Joseph knew his brothers had really changed, he sent his servants away. "Come here," he

But Joseph was kind. "God sent me here for a reason," he said. "Because I am here, I have saved many lives. I can save my family as well. So, it was not you who sent me here but God. Go home and bring everyone back here. The famine will last for five more years. But you will be safe here with me."

Joseph's eleven brothers went back to

Canaan. They told their father that Joseph was alive and wanted them all to go to Egypt.

Joseph rode out in his chariot to meet his family. He hugged his old father and cried with joy. Then





million people.


'What do you have in your hand?" God asked him.

"Throw it on the


ground," God said. As soon as the staff hit the ground, it turned into a snake. When he picked it up it became a staff again.



oses, Aaron, and the leaders of the Israelites went to see the Pharaoh of Egypt. They told Pharaoh God wanted them to pray to Him in the wilderness for three days.

"What? You people don't have enough work to do. I'll fix that," he said.

Pharaoh gave them much more work and their slave drivers were meaner and the Israelites became angry with Moses. So Moses prayed and God sent Moses back again but Pharaoh wouldn't listen.

God sent lice and fleas and great swarms of flies.



A few days later a great storm covered the mountain. Lightning flashed and thunder rolled over the desert.





<u>The fifth is: You will honor your father and mother.</u> Loving our parents is loving God. God gave us our parents and if we can't love and obey them we can never love and obey God.





oses was on the mountain for 40 days and the people thought he was dead. They went to Aaron, Moses' brother. "We don't know where this Moses is, make us a god to lead us," they said. What they wanted was an idol, a statue.

They had all heard God's voice giving them the

Ten

Commandments.

The very first commandment was this: "You will have no other gods but me." And the second was "You will not worship idols." What they wanted went against God's law.

Aaron was afraid of the people, he took all the people's gold jewelry and melted it together to make a golden calf. The

people had a huge party, where they did many bad things, in front of the calf and worshiped it as if it were God.

Up on the mountain God saw what was happening. "Your people are worshiping an idol. I will kill them all for this!"

Moses begged God not to do that. He rushed down the mountain, carrying the two stones with the laws on them. Joshua was waiting for Moses on the way.

Exodus 32:11

but Moses sought the favor of the LORD his God. 'LORD,' he said, 'why should your anger burn against your people, whom you brought out of Egypt with great power and a mighty hand?'"

Moses was so mad that he threw the stones on the ground and broke them. He grabbed the statue and broke it and then he burned the pieces. He ground the burned pieces into a powder and

mixed the powder with water. Then he made all the people drink some of this bad-tasting water as punishment.

Moses also yelled at his brother for making the golden calf. Then he called out, "Everyone who wants to follow God, come over here!"

Only one tribe came over, called the Levites. Moses told them, "Go and kill anyone you find still worshiping the


idol." That day, the sons of Levi killed 3,000 people who were still going against God's first law.

Moses then prayed for the people and God called him up the mountain again. When Moses came back with the laws, the people could not even look at his face. He had been so close to God that his face was shining like the sun.

od knew that the Israelites were not ready to worship a God they could not see. They were used to seeing people worship idols. They needed something they could see every day. God told the Israelites to build a

special tent. They called this tent a tabernacle.

The tabernacle would go with them as long as they were in the desert. The people believed God lived in this tent. They couldn't see Him, but they could see His house. This tent was the place where the priests would do all their and work make sacrifices for the sins of the people as well.

God told them to take an offering and anyone willing to give gold, yarn, linen, wood, fine stones or any of the necessary materials could give them. Everyone brought all that was necessary and God also filled two men with the Holy Spirit so they instantly knew how to make the items for the inside of the tabernacle.

"Then the cloud covered the Tent of Meeting, and the glory of the LORD filled the talernacle"

The tent had everything the people needed to worship God: an altar, candlesticks, different tables, a basin for water and a special chest that


held the stones with the laws on them.

When it was finished, the glory of God filled it as a great cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night. The cloud would lead them on. If the cloud stopped they would stop and if the cloud moved on, they would move on.

Every time the people moved, they packed up the tabernacle and took it with them. The tabernacle was

always at the head of the line, leading them on. The tribe of Levi, which had stayed faithful to God, always carried the tabernacle. Every time the people camped, they set the tabernacle up first. Their own tents went around it. Now they had no need of idols. They had the house of God to see every day.



and The fires lights of the tabernacle were never allowed to go out. There was a special table in the tent that always had bread on it. There was one loaf of flat bread for each of the twelve tribes. On the seventh day of the week fresh bread would be put there. The priests

would then eat the old bread.


The most important part of the tabernacle was the most inner part called the holy of holies. In it was put the chest that contained the Ten Commandments. This was called the ark of the covenant or the chest of the agreement between God and the Israelites. If the Israelites kept the Ten Commandments God promised to make them a kingdom of priests and a holy nation, his treasured possession on earth.

"I am the LORD who brought you up out of Egypt to be your God; therefore be holy, because I am holy."

When God came into the tabernacle his cloud rested over the ark, it was the most holy place and no one could go into it except the priest and no one could carry the ark except the Levites or they would die.

God chose Aaron and his sons to be His priests.


When Aaron was in the tabernacle he had to wear special clothes and a shirt with gold and jewels on it called an ephod. He had to make sure his clothes were clean to show God respect. Aarons family made sacrifices for the Israelites. When they sinned they brought one of their animals to



the Tabernacle. Aaron also had to teach the people what was clean and unclean, what was right and what was wrong. He had to be holy as God is holy.

The Israelites learned how to respect God and worship him with respect and honor him with holy fear. They could begin to see themselves as a kingdom of holy priests.

Theme: God's forgiveness

nside the tabernacle tent was a special room called the Holy of Holies where the Ark of the Covenant was kept. Only the high priest could enter the room—one day in the year—on the Day

A special service was held on the Day of Atonement to make up for the sins of the people during the year. From sunset the day before until three o'clock in the afternoon on the Day of Atonement, no one was allowed to eat anything.

Early on the Day of Atonement the high priest gave a sacrifice, or a sin offering, for himself and his family. The high priest had to

be pure or forgiven, before he could help the people with their sins. Then he took the blood of the young ox he had sacrificed into the Holy of Holies and sprinkled the blood on the golden lid of the Ark of the Covenant as a payment for their sins.

Leviticus 16:30


"because on this day atonement will
be made for you, to cleanse you.
Then, before the LORD, you will
be clean from all your sins."

When the priest came out, two goats were brought to him. One of them would be a sacrifice

for all the people's sins. The high priest would sprinkle some of its blood on the special chest too. other goat—the scapegoat— would be taken far away from camp, never to find its way back. This showed the people that God forgave their sins and sent them far away. Today we use the word scapegoat to mean a person that takes the blame for something.

After the service was over, the people would have a great feast to celebrate God's

forgiveness of their sins. We don't have a special day of atonement, but every day when we pray we should ask God to forgive our sins, because Jesus has paid for us.

Two of the men, Caleb and Joshua, said that didn't matter. "If God is pleased with us he will give us the land. We have already won."


Numbers 14:9b

"None of them will go into the land I have promised them, except for Caleb and Joshua. Go back into the desert."


Because they were afraid to obey God, the people had to spend forty years wandering



The Israelites tried to enter once but the Canaanites were still to strong for them. They


> tried to enter again through the land of Esau's descendants but they said no and they had to go into the desert again.



he Israelites were ready to enter Canaan but to get there, they had to pass through one of the kingdoms around Canaan. But when the Israelites asked if they could pass through each country, the kings came out to battle them instead and God gave the Israelites victory each time.

Soon Balak king of Moab thought that the Israelites would attack him and sent for a man named Balaam. He was a prophet who could talk

to God like Moses. The king's men asked Balaam to come with them and curse the Israelites. But God told him not to go, "The people are to be blessed."

When King Balak heard this he promised Balaam all the money he wanted and great honors if he just cursed the Israelites and this time Balaam went.

While Balaam was riding his donkey, one of God's angels met him on the road. Balaam

couldn't see the angel, though. Only the donkey could see the shining angel with his sword, so he walked off the road and went around him. Balaam hit the donkey and forced him back onto the road.

This happened a second time and then a third and the donkey laid down and Balaam began to beat the donkey. Suddenly, the donkey turned to Balaam. "Why are you hitting me?" the donkey asked.

Balaam was so angry at the donkey that he didn't even wonder how the donkey was talking. "You're not walking the way you should," Balaam said to the donkey. "If I had a sword, I would kill you!"

Suddenly God let Balaam see the shining angel and his sharp sword. Balaam fell to the ground before the angel. Numbers 24:13

"Even if Balak gave me all the silver and gold in his palace, I could not do anything of my own accord, good or bad, to go beyond the command of the Lord—and I must say only what the Lord says?"

"Balaam," the angel said, "you are going the wrong way. If the donkey had not seen me, I would have killed you."

Balaam promised to go back home. But the angel knew he really wanted to go to Moab and

become rich. "You can go," he said. "But only say what God tells you to say."

King Balak took Balaam to the top of a mountain where the Israelites were camped below. But Balaam told Balak he could only say what God gave him, so Balaam blessed them instead of cursing them. Balak took him to another mountain but he blessed them again.

He took him to a third mountain. There Balaam blessed the people of Israel a third time. "Go home!" Balak

third time. "Go home!" Balak yelled to Balaam. "You were supposed to curse these people. Three times you have blessed

So the Moabites began to marry the Israelites and the Israelites began to worship their idols—they were being defeated without fighting!







ON THE EDGE OF THE PROMISED LAND

Numbers 26; Deuteronomy 31-34 Theme: Accepting God's Will

W

hile the Israelites were camped by the Jordan River, God told Moses to count the people.

When they had finished counting all the men over twenty years old, they found there were 600,000 of them. Adding in all the women and children, the Israelites were a good-sized nation of well over a million people. God told Moses and Eleazar,

based on their numbers they would divide up the land they were about to conquer.

Moses, Joshua, and Caleb were the only old men still living. Moses was the oldest, he was 120 now. But God had kept him strong all those years because he was needed to lead the people.

The land the Israelites already controlled on the east of the Jordan River was good for raising animals. Two of the twelve tribes and half of

another tribe asked for this land but promised they would still go to war with all the Israelites. Moses agreed this was fair.

Moses' work was almost done. God told him to gather all the people together one more time and speak to them. As you remember, Moses was not going to be allowed to lead the people across the Jordan River.

Deuteronomy 32:46-47a
"Take to heart all the words I have solemnly declared to you this day, so that you may command your children to obey carefully all the words of this law. They are not just idle words for you—they are your life."

Moses retold all the laws he had learned from God from beginning to end. He told the people to be sure they obeyed God's laws and taught them to their children. He told them "be strong and very

courageous and they would take the land God had promised to them."

God had chosen Joshua, Moses' servant, to be the new leader and told Moses to anoint him. Moses blessed him and turned the people over to Joshua's care.

While all the people watched and cried, Moses walked out of the camp alone. He climbed to the top of Mount Nebo and looked down at the Promised Land below him. Then he quietly lay down on the


down on the mountaintop and died. Because there was no one there to bury Moses properly, God Himself buried him. No man knows where God put the body of Moses, who had served Him for so many years. No man ever lived so near to God or talked to Him like a brother or whom God called his friend, until

Jesus Christ came into the world many years later.




