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A Note on using these materials



The Old Testament studies cover a wide range of chapters, so you probably won't have time to read entire passages but rather a summary of the passage. The passages covered in the summary are in the upper

left hand corner. Children should be encouraged to read the passage at home with their parents. In the upper right hand corner is a key verse which the children can learn or memorize.



On the second page there is a think about it section and a talk about its section. The think about it section summarizes the main points of the Bible passage

and serves as a teacher's guide. The Talk About It questions don't cover every minute detail of the passage but encourage discussion of the main spiritual points. The bolded, underlined questions are questions that don't have a specific answer from the passage but can be discussed giving everyone a chance to give their input. These questions are the focus of the study and the Think About It section gives some guide to answering these questions.





The next page lists around 8 questions for group discussion. The teacher can use these questions to talk with the class about topics that relate the passage to their life so they can get talking and thinking about the application of the passage and have some discussion time.

There is a page for testimony writing (2 for 3^{rd} grade). At the top is space for them to



write one thing they learned and one way they can apply it. This is to assist in testimony writing, since over the course of the week, they often forget the main point of what they learned when they go to write. The testimony section, consists of a brief section for summarizing what they learned and a much longer section describing how they put it into practice or repented this week.

Finally, there's an activity at the end of the lesson. It's good to have fun time to build relationships in the class between each other and the teacher.

Preface

"And Jesus grew in wisdom and stature and favor with God and men." -Luke 2:52

Though there are not many verses mentioned about Jesus' childhood in the Bible, Luke 2:52 shows that Jesus is the role model of our children's education. Jesus was fully man and fully the beloved only Son of God. Boy Jesus was favored by God and men while he was growing in wisdom and stature. We want to know how our children can also be favored by God and men.

In 1994, Chicago CBF formed the curriculum team to serve children's spiritual growth and published two book: one Old Testament and one New Testament. In 2006 we formed the second curriculum team, among teachers who have been serving CBF for more than five years. At the onset we set three goals: 1) to comprehensively teach the Bible in full 2) to assist teachers 3) to help children put the Bible into practice. With these, we gathered together every month for 5 years, prayed and developed 8 books of Bible study materials by grade covering the entire Bible over 8 years.

It was necessary and very fulfilling to make our own materials even though there are so many Bible study materials in the bookstores. We have a special mission and unique task to provide materials which deeply study the Bible for application among CBF children. We know that these books are not perfect. But we believe that God will accept our prayers and labor and use it for raising missionaries and Bible teachers in this generation.

Joshua 1:1-2:24

Theme: Courage, Making a decision of faith

fter Moses died God spoke to Joshua, the new leader of the Israelites. "It's time to cross the Jordan River and take over the land I promised you," God said. Then He told Joshua how big the Israelites' land would be. "Be strong and courageous," God told Joshua. "I will be with you, as I was with Moses. If you read the book of the law that I gave Moses, and do as it says, you will

win." Joshua did what God told him to do. "We will cross the river in three days," he told the people. "Be

ready." A few miles over the Jordan river, in Canaan, was the mighty city of Jericho with its high walls. Jericho had to be destroyed before the Israelites could go any farther.

Joshua sent two men out of the camp on a mission. "Go spy on the city of Jericho for us, be back in two days," he said. The

two men swam the river and walked to Jericho. Once they were in the city, someone reported the strangers to the king, and the king sent men to take them prisoner.

Joshua's two spies hid in the house of a woman named Rahab. She took them in, but

someone saw them going into her house. Soon soldiers were banging on the door. Rahab quickly took the two spies up onto the roof and hid them under long stalks or reeds. When the soldiers could not find the spies,



they left.

Rahab's window was built into the wall and she let the men down safely to the ground. Rahab spoke to the men as they were about to leave her house. "We know God has given this land to you, everyone here is afraid of your people," she told them. "Your God is God in heaven above and on the earth below. Promise you will save me and my family when vou take this city?"

"Yes," the spies promised. "We will see

no harm comes to your family. Tell your family to stay inside your house until the city is taken. We will tell your men not to harm anyone in the house with the scarlet rope hanging out the window."

When the two spies returned to Joshua, they had good news. "Everyone is afraid of us! We will be able to take this land as God promised."



By Faith

Joshua 3-6 Theme: Faith, Obedience

fter the spies returned from Jericho, Joshua made the camp ready to cross the Jordan river. Soon they were near the banks of the river. The river was deepest at this time of year. The people were sure many of them would die trying to get across to the other side.

Joshua prayed and God told him what to do. Joshua called out to the priests. "Bring the Ark of

the Covenant to the front. Everyone else is to stay at least 3,000 feet behind."

As soon as the feet of the priests touched the water, the river stopped flowing! The water coming downstream just stopped above them and piled up. Then Joshua ordered the rest of the people to cross the river.

Once everyone was safely across the river Joshua called the leaders of the twelve tribes together. "Go gather rocks from the river bed," he said. "Make a pillar of rock here on the shore. My great great uncle tells me a similar SDD Sudden Drought Syndrome occured about 40 years ago at the Red Sea. A large number of Jews were present then too.

Make another in the middle of the river. This will help you and your children remember what God did for you this day."

When that was done, the priests carried the Ark of the Covenant to the shore. The river flowed again, as if nothing strange had ever happened there. Joshua 4:24

"He did this so that all the peoples of the earth might know that the hand of the LORD is powerful and so that you might always fear the LORD your God.""

The people made a new camp on the plain of the Jordan River, at a place called Gilgal. There they ate the fruits and vegetables of Canaan for the first time and after that the manna never dropped again from the sky.

Now Joshua had to deal with Jericho. Joshua

went away from the camp to pray and study the city. All of a sudden Joshua saw an armed man walking toward him. Joshua called out, "Are you on our side? Or are you an enemy?"

"No," said the man. "I am the captain of the Lord's army."

Then Joshua saw the man was an angel of the Lord. He bowed down. "What does the Lord want to tell His servant?" Joshua asked the angel.

"Take off your shoes. You are on holy

ground," the angel said.

Then God said to him, "I have given you Jericho. I will destroy the city for you." The Lord told him that they would not have to fight their way in but they would march around the city for seven days and God would make the wall fall down. It seemed impossible but Joshua believed God and the people went up against the huge city of Jericho by faith in God Almighty.

Joshua 6:1-27 Theme: Faith, Obedience

he Israelites gathered themselves together for war. In front were the herdsmen soldiers from the east bank of the Jordan. Following them were the priests, blowing loud horns. Then came the Ark of the Covenant on the shoulders of other priests. Then

came each tribe of the Israelites, marching in order. No one spoke. No one shouted. The only sound was that of the rams' horns blowing. That day they walked all around the city of Jericho once before marching back to their camp.

A great cry came from all the people at once. They saw the city walls begin to shake and tremble. Piece by piece, the walls crashed down before them. Only one piece of wall still stood: the wall two spies. While this was being done, the rest of the soldiers: went into Jericho. No one fought them. The city was theirs.

Jericho was a rich city, and now everything in it belonged to the Israelites. But Joshua ordered everything brought to him.

The gold and silver and brass and iron was given to the priests for the tabernacle. Everything else was gathered up and burned as a sacrifice to the Lord, who had given them the city.

Then the city itself was destroyed and burned and cursed forever.

And what happened to Rahab, the woman who had saved the spies? She lived with the Israelites from then on. She married a prince from the tribe of Judah, a man named Salmon. And from their marriage came children who would be the ancestors of David, a great king of the Israelites.





God is watching

Joshua 7:1-8:35 Theme: Obey God, Don't try to hide your sin

R emember how Joshua burned all the treasures in Jericho as an offering to God? That was because everything in

the city of Jericho belonged to God since God had conquered the city for the Israelites.

While the Israelites were taking Jericho, a man named Achan, found a house filled with beautiful

things. There was a beautiful piece of clothing and a wedge of gold and some silver. When he saw there was no one looking, Achan took these beautiful things and hid them in his tent. But God had seen what Achan had done.

After Jericho was taken, Joshua turned to the little town of Ai. Because Ai was a small place, Joshua only sent 3,000 men to take it. To the Israelites' surprise, the men of Ai fought well and most of the Israelites died.

Joshua and the Israelites were worried. Wasn't

God on their side anymore? If they couldn't take a little place like Ai, how could they capture the whole country of Canaan?

Joshua prayed to God, asking what had gone wrong. God told him that one of the Israelites had stolen something promised to Him. Until the


treasure was returned and the man punished, there would be a curse on the Israelites.

Early the next morning the Lord showed Joshua that Achan was the thief. As punishment, he and his family were killed by the Israelites. This taught

> everyone an important lesson. If they wanted God to fight on their side, they had to obey Him very carefully.

> The next time Joshua sent an army to Ai the Israelites took the city. God gave him the best plan. One part of the army marched out to fight and then ran away. The soldiers of Ai chased after them. Then the rest of the army went into the totally unguarded city and took it easily. Then they came after the army of Ai and

the Israelites that were running away turned and fought. The soldiers of Ai were caught in the middle of two armies with no chance. With God on their side, victory was easy and hardly any Israelites died in battle. This time God even let them keep everything valuable they found in the city.

A Blunder becomes a victory

Joshua 9:1-27; 10:1-14, 29-30; 11:1-6,12,16,21 Theme: Pray first, God wins the Victory for us

ews of the power of the Israelites had spread quickly. The next city the Israelites would attack was Gibeon. The Gibeonites knew they could not defeat the Israelites, so they decided to make peace with them.

The men they sent into the Israelite camp only

lived a little ways from there, but they dressed old clothes and in carried old food with them. They wanted Joshua to think they lived far away and had traveled a long time to see him. Joshua didn't pray, so he believed and promised them notto destroy their cities or hurt their people.

It didn't take long for Joshua to discover he had been tricked but a promise is a promise.

So, Joshua made the Gibeonites servants of the Israelites. From then on the Gibeonites would cut wood, carry water, and do the hard work that needed to be done in a camp.

When the other kings heard the Gibeonites had made peace with the Israelites they decided to punish the Gibeonites for serving their enemy, the Israelites.

When the Gibeonites heard an army was marching against them, they rushed to Joshua and asked him for help. They were his servants, and Joshua Joshua 10:

"The LORD said to Joshua, 'Do not be afraid of them; I have given them into your hand. Not one of them will be able to withstand you."


had to protect them. This time Joshua prayed and God told Joshua, "Do not be afraid of them; I have given them into your hand. Not one of them will be able to stand up to you."

Joshua was a good general. He immediately

gathered together his army. They marched all night over the mountains. Early in the morning he surprised the five kings. This was a very important battle for the Israelites. Here they could defeat five kings at once. And since all five kings worshiped idols, and not the one true God, it was an important battle for God too.

To help the people, God sent a hailstorm down on the kings. The hailstones killed more people than the

Israelites' swords. Soon all five armies were running away, with Joshua and his men right behind them. Joshua asked God to make the sun stand still so it would be light until they won and God did this for him, so that all of them were defeated. The five kings tried to hide in a cave but Joshua found them and sealed them in the cave with a big rock. This victory gave the Israelites control of all the southern part of Canaan.



Joshua 14:1-19:51 Theme: Trust in God, Don't do what's easy

he great wars in Canaan were over. That didn't mean that the Israelites were the only people living there or that they owned all the cities. So Joshua divided up the land between the 12 tribes so each tribe could conquer their part.

One day Caleb and the leaders of the tribe of Judah came to see Joshua. Caleb was one of the two spies who had wanted to go into the land forty-five years before. Although Caleb was eighty-five years old, God had kept him strong and healthy. Now Caleb had a favor to ask of Joshua.

"Fine," said Joshua. "Gather together your men and take your city" And Caleb did just that. He drove the giants out of the city, and his family lived in Hebron for many years.

After this God told Joshua to divide up the rest of the land among the people. After years of living in the desert the people were finally going to have their own land.

Now all the Israelites had their own land, but

they would not live in peace. Nearly all the Canaanites were still there.

Up to now this area had been called Canaan after the Canaanites who lived there. From now on the land would be known as Israel or the land of the 12 tribes.

The Avenger of Blood

Joshua 20-21 Theme: Revenge is God's, God's Faithfulness

he people of Israel had many customs and laws that seem unusual to us. They were still a rather wild people and hard to control. Their ideas of wrong and right were not the same as ours, and their tribal customs were different from our family traditions. One of their customs was that of the avenger of

blood. Accidents happened in the wilderness. People got angry and killed each When other. that happened, the victim's appointed tribe an avenger of blood to take revenge. The person would find whoever killed their relative and kill him in turn. If he

couldn't find the person, he would kill a close relative. This happened whether the first death happened on purpose or by accident. It wasn't a fair system and innocent people often died.

God knew that he couldn't order this to stop. The people hadn't listened to Moses and they wouldn't listen to Joshua. But maybe he could change the custom to protect innocent people. After the land had been divided up, Joshua chose six cities and made them cities of refuge. These cities were spread around the land, so everyone was only one or two days away from one.

If a person accidentally killed another person (or even if he did it on purpose), he would run to the nearest city of refuge. The avenger of blood would

chase after him. If he caught the man before he got to the city of refuge, he would kill him. But if the man made it safely to the city, the avenger could not do anything.

The elders of the city of refuge would look into

the case and see if the murder was an accident or had been done on purpose. If it had been done on purpose, they sent the killer out of the city, and the avenger of blood usually got him. But if he had not meant to kill anyone, he was allowed to stay there and farm some land

especially set aside for innocent people. He would stay there until the high priest of the nation died and was replaced by a new high priest. When that happened, he was free to go home and no one could hurt him.

After setting up the six cities of refuge, Joshua set up the tabernacle in Shiloh, near the center of the land. This made it easy for people to come and worship there three times a year: on Passover, the Feast of the Tabernacles, and the Feast of Pentecost. In all the land of Israel this would be the only altar for worshiping God. Now the land God had promised the Israelites had been divided up fairly among them. Their wandering days were over.





he first people to leave the camp at Gilgal were those who had left their families on the east side of the Jordan River. They had kept their promise to Moses. They had fought, even though they already had their own land. Joshua praised them for their faithfulness and commanded them always to serve God with all their heart and soul.

When they came to the west side of the Jordan river, they built a pile of stones. They built it on a high place, so it could be seen from far away.

By now Joshua was almost 110 years old. So he called all the leaders of the tribes to meet him in

Shechem. When they were all together, he told them their history again from way back to Abraham and Jacob and Moses. He told them every single thing God had done for them over the years. He said that everything they had was a gift from God.


Then he asked the people to make a choice. Would they promise to serve God forever? Or would they listen to the other people nearby and serve other gods?

"We promise to serve our God only," the people said. Joshua wrote that promise down in the book of the law, so

it would be remembered forever. Soon Joshua died. As long as there were people alive who remembered the great general who had led the people of Israel into the promised land, the people were faithful to God.



Judges 4:1-24, 5:31b Theme: Obedience, Courage, Faith

ne of the times that Israel forgot God they were attacked by the Canaanites. The general of the Canaanites was Sisera, and his army was known far and wide for its iron chariots drawn by horses and they easily defeated the

Israelites in the northern part of Israel and ruled them very hard for 20 years.

During this time, Debora was the only woman judge. People came from all over to get her advice. The people did what she said because they knew God was with her. Deborah knew that the Israelites in the north were suffering under the Canaanites. She sent a message to Barak, a brave man she knew who lived in that region.

She told him to gather together an army and attack

the Canaanite army to the north. Barak was a good man, but he did not think he could win this battle alone. So he sent a message back to Deborah. "I will go," he said. "But only if you come with me."

Deborah agreed to go with him. But because Barak did not trust God, she said he would not be given the honor of defeating the Canaanites. The honor would go to a woman.

Deborah and Barak collected 10,000 men for the battle. The Israelite army looked awfully small.

"Go down and fight," Deborah told Barak.



"'Certainly I will go with you,' said Deborah. 'But because of the course you are taking, the honor will not be yours, for the Lord will deliver Sisera into the hands of a woman.""

"The Lord will go before you and give you the victory." Barak and his army rushed down so fast that the Canaanites didn't have time to hitch up their horses.

> Without their chariots and horses, the Canaanites were just normal people, and soon the Israelites were chasing them away.


There was a deep and dangerous brook in the valley. As the Canaanites ran away they pushed and shoved their way into the brook. Many of them were drowned.

When the Canaanite general, Sisera, saw the battle was lost, he ran away too. He found a tent standing all by itself in the valley and rushed to it for help. The tent was owned by a man

named Heber and his wife, Jael. Jael knew who Sisera was and motioned him into her tent. Then she hid him under a rug so no one would find him.


Sisera, still hiding under the rug, asked Jael for a drink of water. She brought him milk instead, and soon he fell asleep. When he was sound asleep Jael took a hammer and tent spike. She crept up to Sisera and pounded the stake right through his head.

Jael was treated like a hero by the Israelites from then on. As Deborah had predicted, a woman—Jael had freed her people.



nce more the Israelites turned away from God to worship idols. This time the Midianites attacked them. They took everything the Israelites grew, leaving them nothing to eat.

One day a man named Gideon was hiding some

wheat so the Midianites would not find it. Suddenly he saw an angel under an oak tree. "You are a brave man, Gideon," the angel said. "Go set your people free from the Midianites. But first you must stop them from worshipping idols."

That night Gideon took ten men with him and knocked down the town idols. Then he built an altar to God and used the pieces to light his offering fire.

The next morning the people who worshiped those

idols came to Gideon's father to kill Gideon. "If your god is so great let him kill Gideon," his father said. Of course nothing happened. When the people saw that nothing happened to Gideon, they turned back to worshiping the one true God.

Before going to war Gideon wanted a sign, so he asked God to make a fleece he laid outside wet with dew but all the ground dry, then do the opposite the next night. God did both things, and Gideon believed.

Gideon gathered a great army together to defeat the Midianites. Then he spoke to God.

"Your army is too large," God said. "Send home anyone who is afraid to fight." That day, 22,000 men strength you have and save Israel out of Midian's hand. Am I not sending you?"

left the army and went home. Now Gideon's army had only 10,000 men.

God said, "The army is still too big. Take them down to the river to drink. And only keep those who drink

> with their mouth." Out of the 10,000 men only 300 had stayed ready to fight while they drank, keeping their weapons in their hands. Gideon kept the 300 men with him. The rest he sent back to the top of the mountain.

> God then told him the plan for victory. Gideon gave each man a lamp, a pitcher, and a trumpet. They put the lighted lamps inside the pitchers Then they quietly surrounded the Midianite camp in the middle of the night. The Midianites were like the sand on the seashore, there were so many.

After the Lord trims a 32,000 man army down to lean mean 300, he arms them with trumpets and jars. Judges 7:8

> All his men shouted at once, broke their pitchers, and let their lamps shine. Then they all blew their trumpets as loudly as they could.

The Midianites woke up, terrified. All around them they saw lights and flashing swords. The air was filled with the sound of trumpets. Thinking there were thousands of men ready to kill them, they started fighting each other. Then they ran off but the 10,000 men on the mountain raced down and cut off the fleeing army, killing many. Then ahead of them was the other army coming to help Gideon. They totally defeated them and the Midianites never came into Israel again.



Jephthah's Foolish pronise

Judges 9-11 Theme: Bible Faith not Emotional Faith

hen Gideon and the three judges after him were dead, the people returned to worshiping idols. This time the Ammonites attacked them.

They took over the land of the tribes that lived on the east side of the Jordan River. The Israelites cried out to God but he was very angry with them

and told them to ask their idols for help. The got rid of all their idols and kept crying out to him until he could bear it no more.

Finally, a man named Jephthah brought together an army to fight the Ammonites.

Before he went into battle Jephthah made a promise to God. "If you let me beat the Ammonites, whatever comes out

of my house first to meet me when I come home will be Yours. I will offer it up as a burnt offering to You."

Jephthah lived a long way from the tabernacle. Although he worshiped God, he didn't know God's laws very well. God had made it plain years ago what kind of sacrifices He wanted.

Jephthah won his battle. But when he returned home the first thing to come out of his house was not a lamb or an ox. It was his only child, his daughter! happened.

From these stories we can see hew the Israelites lived during the time of the judges, a period of 200 years. No one man ruled over them all. Many families obeyed God's laws the best they could. But others didn't. Some of the tribes lived free. Others lived under the control of other people. Life was dangerous, and people were sometimes foolish. But through it all, God stayed faithful to His people, the children of Israel.

Judges 10:16

"Then they got rid of the foreign gods among them and served the LORD. And he could bear Israel's misery no longer."

Jephthah told his daughter about his promise to God. Although she must have been very frightened, she told her father he must keep his promise to God. All she asked was to go into the countryside with her friends for two months

to prepare herself. At the end of that time she came home and Jephthah kept his promise to God: Jephthah's daughter was burned on the altar as a sacrifice.

This was the only time the Israelites had ever offered a living person as a sacrifice to God. If Jephthah had known the laws of God better, such a horrible thing would never have



fter Jephthah three other judges ruled the Israelites. But the people turned back to their idols again. This time the Philistines attacked them and conquered all of Israel, not just a few tribes.

One day an angel came to a man named Manoah


whose wife couldn't have children. He told the man that his wife was going to have a son who would save Israel but the boy must be dedicated to God—a Nazarite. He could never drink any wine, and his hair could never be cut. This would be the sign that he was dedicated to God.

The baby was named Samson. Samson grew up to become the strongest man in the Bible. But Samson fell in love with a Philistine woman and told his parents to get her as his

wife. His parents weren't happy but this was from God who wanted to attack the Philistines.

One day when Samson was walking along the road to visit this young woman, a young lion pounced out of the bushes and jumped on him. Samson was so strong he killed the lion with his bare hands.

A short time later Samson took the same road to his marriage feast. On the way he came to the dead lion. He saw that bees had made a nest and the lion's body was full of honey.

During the wedding feast everyone started telling riddles. "I'll give you a riddle," Samson said to a group of Philistines. "If you can't answer it, you

> owe me thirty suits of clothing. "Out of the eater, something to eat; out of the strong, something sweet."

> For three days they tried to find the answer and finally asked Samson's new wife to find the answer for them. She bugged him non-stop until he told her, then she told the others, and Samson owed them thirty suits of clothing.

> Samson paid his bet, but not the way the Philistines thought he would. He went out and killed the first thirty Philistines he saw, then gave their clothing to the others!


Samson was so mad at his wife that he went back to his parents' house for a while.

When he went back, her father had married her to another man. This got Samson mad again. He found wild foxes, tied them together and put a torch between their tails and turned the foxes loose in the Philistine fields. The foxes ran everywhere and burned down all the crops.

Because of Samson's act of rage, the Philistines killed Samson's wife and her father. The killing continued until Samson left the area to hide for a while but he vowed to be their enemy forever.





he Philistines continued to make life terrible for the rest of the Israelites. When the Israelites complained to Samson, he let them tie him up and turn him over to the Philistines. The Philistines laughed at him when they saw him being turned over by his own people. But they didn't laugh long. As soon as he

was near them, Samson broke the ropes holding him. He reached down and picked up the jawbone of a donkey that was nearby. Using the jawbone as a sword, Samson killed over 1,000 Philistines that day alone. Samson was amazingly strong but he had one weakness. He saw a beautiful Philistine woman named Delilah

and he had to have her as his wife even though the Philistines were his enemies. She was a bad woman. The Philistines made her promise to find out what made Samson so strong. Day after day, she pestered him. "If you loved me, you would tell me," she said. Samson would tell her a lie every time .Every time she did what he told her, nothing happened to him and he beat up all the Philistines that suddenly showed up. But she kept pestering him so long that he finally told her the truth.

"If my hair is ever cut," he said, "I will no longer be strong." Judges 16:28

"Then Samson prayed to the LORD, 'Sovereign LORD, remember me. Please, God, strengthen me just once more, and let me with one blow get revenge on the Philistines for my two eyes."

That night Delilah cut Samson's hair while he slept. The Philistines rushed in and captured him without a struggle. Then they blinded him and kept. him tied up. They would bring him in and laugh at him whenever they felt like it. Of course,

> Samson's hair was beginning to grow again. One day there was a great Philistine feast. The Philistine temple was filled with people. Over 3,000 more were standing on the roof of the temple, hoping to see Samson. All the rulers were there as well.

Samson leaned against a column of the temple. He

quietly asked God to give him back his strength just one more time. Then he pushed on two columns with all his strength, pulling the temple down on top of himself and thousands of Philistines.

The people of Samson's tribe found his body and buried him in his own land. Samson wasn't a great judge or tribal leader. All he did to Israel's enemies, he did on his own. Maybe he could have done even more if he had been a great leader and if he didn't have such a problem with women. But at the end of his life Samson asked for God's help and God was with him. With God's help Samson saved Israel from its enemies.

wring the time of the judges there was a man named Micah. He and his mother lived in the mountains of Ephraim near the road that ran from north to south.

Micah stole 1,100 pieces of silver that belonged to his

mother and made himself two idols. He set the idols up in his house and made one of his sons his priest. In a little while a young Levite, named Jonathan son of Gershom, passed by Micah's house. The Levites all served as priests in Israel. When Micah offered him a job as his private priest, the young man was very happy, even through he would serve an idol.

One day five men from the tribe of Dan stopped at Micah's house. These five men were looking for a

new home for the tribe away from the dangerous Philistines. They knew the young priest and asked what he was doing in Micah's house, so he showed them the idols and the altar that Micah had set up.

After they left Micah the five men found a small city to the north that would be easy to capture because the people were peaceful—it was cruel to attack them. When they went back to Dan and told the people about the city, part of the tribe decided to move there. In addition to wives and children and flocks, there were 600 men with shields and swords and spears.

"There the Danites set up for themselves the idols, and Jonathan son of Gershom, the son of Moses, and his sons were priests for the tribe of Dan until the time of the captivity of the land."

As the little army neared Micah's house, one of the five men told them about the temple and priest in the

house.

They took the idols away from Micah and convinced the priest to come with them and be their priest. There was nothing Micah could do to stop them.

The people from Dan easily took the little city in the mountains. They rebuilt it and named it Dan, after their tribe. Then they built their own temple for the two idols, and the priest served the idols for many years.

The saddest part of this story concerns the young

Levite. Instead of serving God as he was supposed to, he was serving idols. This young man was the grandson of Moses!

Because the temple at Dan was much closer to the people in the north than Shiloh, many of them worshiped at it, forgetting about the God who had taken them out of Egypt. As the conclusion to the book of Judges, we can see how far the people had fallen from God when they always turned to idol worship.






When Naomi saw how

he fourteenth judge of the Israelites was an old man named Eli. He was also the high priest of the tabernacle. About fifteen miles away from the tabernacle lived a man named Elkanah. He had two wives, a common practice in those times. One of them had

children, but the other, a woman named Hannah, did not. Every year Elkanah and his wives would go to the tabernacle to pray.

One year Hannah prayed to the Lord for a child. "If You give me a son," she told God, "he will serve You all his life." God heard her prayer, and soon she and Elkanah had a baby boy whom they named Samuel.

When Samuel was old enough to leave his

mother, Hannah brought him to Eli and told him of her promise to God. From then on Samuel lived with Eli and served God. He would help in the tabernacle and do work for Eli, who was very old. And every year Hannah would visit her son.

God's House is Missing

1 Samuel 4-6 Theme: God's Power

> hile Eli was still the judge, the Philistines attacked the Israelites again, killing many men. So they

said, "Let's take the Ark of the Covenant with us, so God will be with us."

God was still not with the Israelites. Not only were thousands of them killed, but the Philistines took the Ark of the Covenant back home with them after the battle.

When Eli heard the sad news that his sons were killed and the ark stolen, he dropped to the ground, dead.

Because the Ark of the Covenant was the home of God, God was showing them that God no longer lived among them.

The Philistines took the Ark of the Covenant and set it in the temple of Dagon, their main idol.

The next morning they found the statue of Dagon on the floor in front of the holy chest. They stood Dagon back up again, but the next morning, the statue was on the floor again. This time the hands and head of the idol had been cut off too.

When all the people in Ashdod came down with painful boils and sores on their bodies, they moved the Ark of the Covenant to the city of Gath. <u>1 Samuel 4:22</u> "The Glory has departed from Israel, for the ark of God has been captured."

Everyone there got sick, too, so they sent it to Ekron. The people there would not let the holy

Then they sent the Ark of the Covenant to another town. For twenty years the Ark of the Covenant stayed in the house of a man there. They could not take the chest back to Shiloh because after Eli died everyone left the town and no one ever lived there again.

chest into the city. "Send it back to Israel," they said, "before we all die." The Philistines loaded the Ark onto a wagon, hitched two cows to it, and sent them off in the direction of Israel and the cows walked straight there all by themselves. God had saved the ark

himself. The cows stopped by some fields outside the Israelite town of Bethshemesh. When the people saw the Ark of the Covenant on the wagon they broke the wagon up for its wood, set a fire, and offered the two cows as a sacrifice to God for



amuel was still a boy when Eli died and the Ark of the Covenant left Shiloh. All alone now, he went back to his father's house in Ramah. While he was growing up the Philistines ruled Israel. The people were very sad and wanted God but they didn't know how to do it.

As soon as Samuel became a man, he began to travel to all the tribes of Israel. He told them all the same thing. If they would stop worshiping idols. commit themselves to God and serve Him only, God would set them free of the Philistines. When everyone had heard his messagewhich they knew came from God-they began to worship God again.

Samuel called

everyone to a great meeting in a place called Mizpah. He prayed for the people and asked God to forgive their sins. They poured water out before the Lord. Then he promised they would serve God faithfully.

The Philistines saw all the people gathered together and thought they were getting ready for

war. They sent an army to drive everyone back to their homes.

The Israelites saw the Philistines coining and were frightened. They didn't have any swords or spears with them. They were not trained to fight. The Philistines would kill them all. They begged Samuel to ask God for help.

Samuel gave a sacrifice and prayed and a terrible storm blew over them, with thunder and lightning and huge, dark clouds and the Philistines were afraid. They threw down their weapons and

ran from the storm. The men of Israel picked up the Philistines' weapons, chased after them, and won a great battle.

The Philistines stayed away from Israel for many years after that. Samuel ruled over the people as the last of the judges. He was wise and fair, and he kept the people faithful to God.

1 Samuel 8-10 Theme: God's is our king


hen Samuel became an old man the people came to him and said, "We need a king, so we can be like all the other nations."

Samuel didn't want to do this. He knew God was the real king of the people. He also felt a little hurt

that the people rejected his sons as judges. But God told Samuel

not to be hurt it was God they were rejecting as their king not him.

Samuel told them a king would take away their sons and make them into soldiers. A king would take their daughters and make them servants. He would take away part of their crops and some of their animals. "If you do this," he warned them, "there will come a time



you will be sorry. You will call on the Lord for help, and He will not hear you."

But the people would not listen. God told Samuel to do as the people said and find them a king.

A young man named Saul lived in the smallest of all the tribes, the tribe of Benjamin. He was the tallest man anyone had ever seen, and very handsome. One day when he was out looking for some donkeys that had wandered away, he came to Samuel's town of Ramah.

When Samuel and Saul met, God told Samuel





1 Samuel 11-12 Theme: Only God is King

aul was legally the king of Israel, but he didn't change his way of living. He stayed in his old home and worked the same fields he had always worked. He didn't live in a palace or have servants or collect taxes from the people.

One day a messenger came to Saul from the

town of Jabesh. The Ammonites on the east of Israel had attacked Jabesh. The people there knew they could not win a battle against the Ammonites, so they made a deal with them. They promised to serve the Ammonites if they would let them live. The Ammonite king agreed on one condition: In a

week his soldiers would come into town and take out the right eye of every man in town.

The men didn't want to lose their eyes, so they asked Saul for help. Then the Spirit of God came upon him and he burned with anger. Saul didn't have an army. He didn't even know if the people would come and fight for him but he took the oxen he was using in the fields, killed them, and cut them into twelve pieces. He sent one piece to

<u>1 Samuel 12:24</u>

" But be sure to fear the LORD and serve him faithfully with all your heart; consider what great things he has done for you."

each of the twelve tribes, along with this message: "Come to fight with Saul and Samuel, or this will happen to all your oxen."


All the tribes sent their fighting men to Saul and

Samuel, who led them into Jabesh and defeated the Ammonites. After the battle Samuel led everyone to Gilgal.

There the people all anointed Saul as King. Samuel reminded all the people of the great things God had done for them in the past. He had taken them out of Egypt, given them their

own homes, and given them the judges. "You have done wrong to choose a king," Samuel told them. "But as long as you fear the Lord, obey the Lord, and do not rebel against him, everything will go well for you. I will always pray for you and teach you the right way," he promised.

Then Samuel went back to his home in Ramah and Saul ruled as king from his home in Gibeah.

1 Samuel 13:1-14:46 Theme: Obedience better than Strength

> hen Saul was anointed as king, the first thing he did was to get an army together to attack the

Philistines. Some of them men were with Saul and some with Jonathan. Jonathan was a brave young man and he attacked a Philistine outpost and won. When word of this was heard, the Philistines

gathered a great army to attack Saul and Jonathan.

Saul called for more soldiers to meet him at Gilgal, and the people came. But they were frightened, and not really willing to fight. None of them had weapons, only farm tools. Samuel sent word that Saul could not attack until he had come to sacrifice to



God and pray for the people. But it took Samuel a long time to get there. And while Saul waited, the frightened people began to sneak away from his camp. His army was getting smaller and smaller. Finally Saul was afraid to wait any longer. He offered his own sacrifice and prayed to God himself, even though he was not a priest.

While the fire was still burning, Samuel arrived. "What have you done?" Samuel cried. "If you had obeyed God, He would have kept you safe. Now God must find another man to rule this nation, someone who will obey Him."

When Jonathan saw all the scared soldiers he decided to go fight. He went to the priests

"Come, let's go over to the outpost of those uncircumcised men. Perhaps the LORD will act in our behalf. Nothing can hinder the LORD from saving, whether by many or by few."

to ask for God's direction then went up and defeated an entire outpost of the Philistines with only his armor bearer!

Then the Philistines became afraid and Saul won a great victory over the Philistines. While they

> were chasing the Philistines away, Saul gave an order to all his army. No one was to stop and eat until the day was over. Anyone who did not obey would be killed.

> But the battle would have been over earlier if his men had eaten and kept up their strength.

Jonathan got back from destroying the outpost and had not heard Saul's order. As he was chasing the Philistines, he stopped to eat some honey. After the battle Saul heard that his son had disobeyed him. "I made an oath," Saul said. "You must die."

But the people would not let Saul kill his own son. "He has won a great victory," they said. "You will not hurt even one hair on his head." They let Jonathan go free. Saul did many other things that were against God's law and he didn't even know or care.

The Philistines stayed away from Israel for a long time after this battle. But the Israelites were beginning to wonder if Saul was the right man to be their king.



any years ago when the Israelites had just come out of Egypt a wild people of the desert, the Amalekites, had attacked them

because they were defenseless. They were an evil people who even sacrificed their children to their god. God told Saul, through Samuel, to go attack these people. God said that Saul should kill every one of these people. He must destroy everything that even belonged to them keeping nothing, not even their animals.

Saul went and defeated these people. But he did not kill their king, Agag, and he kept all the best of

"Is God happy with sacrifices more than obeying him? To obey is better than sacrifice."


Saul acted like he was sorry but Samuel turned





"The Lord helped me kill lions and bears when they came after my sheep," David said to the king. "He will help me kill this man too."



fter Goliath was dead Saul made David an officer in his army and took him home with him. Whatever Saul sent David to do, he did so well that he gave him a high rank and put him in charge of 1,000 men.

But Saul was jealous of David. Everyone made

such a fuss over him. They even sang "Saul has killed thousands and David ten thousands!" Could he be the one who would take the kingdom away from him?

> While they were together the two young men promised to be friends forever and to never hurt each other.





avid ran away from Saul so quickly that he didn't pack any food or weapons. On his way he stopped at Nob, where the priests of God lived, to find some food.

David went to the chief priest and told him a lie,

maybe to protect him from knowing he was helping him escape. He said Saul had sent him on a secret mission. He had to leave so soon that he didn't have time pack food to or weapons. Did the priests have something he could eat and perhaps a spear or a sword?

Everyone in the kingdom heard that Saul had killed the priests and that the new high priest was now living with David. They began hoping that David would defeat Saul and become their king.



hile David was running from Saul he and his army hid for a while in the dessert of Moan in Carmel. There a very mean man named Nabal, owned a lot of land and cattle.

1 Samuel 28:1-31:13 Theme: Wickedness will make us lonely, Without God we cannot win

he next time the Philistines attacked the Israelites, their king told David he had to fight on their side since he was living with the Philistines, after all. It was terrible to fight his own country but David and his 600 men went and joined the army.

But other Philistines did not trust David. "He will

turn on us and fight for his own people," they said. They sent David and his men back to their own town. But when they got home a terrible surprise awaited them. The wild men from the desert had attacked while David was gone and had taken everything and burned the city. All their wives and children had been taken away as slaves. Even David's two wives were gone.

David chased after the men from the desert and caught them. Some of them escaped into the

desert on camels, but the rest he killed. Then he took back everything that was his, and all that had been stolen from other cities. He divided all this up among his own men. Now David was a rich man.

Meanwhile, Saul was about to be attacked by the Philistine army. Samuel was dead. David was

gone. And Saul knew that God was not with him anymore. He needed some help.

"Why are you bothering me?" Samuel's spirit asked "I need help," Saul answered. "Tell me what to do."

"You did not obey God. Tomorrow you and your three Sons will die," Samuel's spirit told Saul.

The next day the Philistines attacked the Israelites' camp when they were not ready to fight. Many were killed, including Saul's son Jonathan, David's friend. When Saul saw the battle was lost and his sons were dead, killed he himself with his own sword.

Saul had been king for forty years. During that entire period he had fought the Philistines. David could have helped him, but Saul in his jealousy had chased him away. Samuel could have helped him, but Saul would not obey God. After Saul's death the Philistines took over the land of Israel.







> Mephibosheth lived so far away from Jerusalem. When he was called to David's palace, the crippled man was afraid he was about to be killed.


"Don't be afraid," David told Mephibosheth. "I loved your father, and he loved me. All





Then David saw how bad he had been to Uriah and begged the Lord's forgiveness.


"You are forgiven," Nathan



> he prophet Nathan warned David that bad things would happen to him and his family, and they did.

One of David's favorite sons was named Absalom. David's son Amnon had tried to take his sister as his wife by force, so Absalom killed him and ran away. But, David loved him so much he called him back and let Absalom back into his palace.

Absalom wanted to be king in place of his father. He did favors for everyone he met and treated everyone nicely. He would promise people anything they wanted. As time went by, more and people more loved Absalom. At the end of four years Absalom asked David if he could go to Hebron to worship God.

It may seem strange,

but David had no idea what this man—his son—was trying to do because he wasn't taking care of his kingdom.

Soon afterward word came from Hebron. Absalom had made himself the new king! David heard that many of the rulers were with Absalom, and the people wanted him as king. He took a few of his servants, his wives, and his children and left Jerusalem.

Absalom sought advice from one of the royal advisers, who told him to attack David while he was weak but another adviser, who was loyal to David, convinced him that David was a fighter and he could not win. This was from God who wanted to destroy Absalom. Absalom waited. He would stay there until

his own army was stronger and bigger, and then he would kill his father. While Absalom waited, David's army grew bigger and bigger.

> David's army won a great victory that day. Absalom was forced to run away from the battlefield. As he rode through a deep wood, his long hair caught in the branches of an oak tree leaving Absalom hanging from the tree branches.

> Joab, David's general, rushed into the woods and killed the young man. This was against David's orders,


but if he had lived, Absalom would have been a problem again.

When David heard that his son was dead, he cried for days. His army came back but no one treated them like the heroes they were.



hen David grew old he began to collect wood and gold and silver to be used for building God's temple. But God would not let David build it because David was a fighter. God said David's son Solomon would be a king of peace and he would build it. So, while he lived, David stored up all that

Solomon would need and David promised Bathsheba that her son Solomon would be king after him.

Now it was many years later and David became sick. No matter how many covers they put on him he could no longer keep warm and had to stay in bed. Since he could no longer rule, Absalom's next youngest brother, Adonijah, tried to make himself king without telling David. When David heard of this, he decided to crown

Solomon king right away. Solomon's head was anointed with oil. The priests blew their horns in celebration. From his bed David sent his blessing to the new king and bowed down in worship to God for his blessing.


Adonijah, who had tried to crown himself king, ran to the tabernacle to pray and hide. But Solomon forgave him and those who had followed him and he returned to the palace peacefully.

Soon David died at a

good old age. He had been king of Israel for thirtythree years. He was buried on Mount Zion and remains to this day the greatest and most beloved king of Israel.





olomon's great work was building the temple of God. David had collected a lot of the materials that would be needed and Solomon got the rest by making deals with other kings. All the pieces of the temple were made to fit together perfectly.

The temple was built very much like the tent tabernacle. The large temple structure had one

large room and many side rooms and behind that was the Holy of Holies, where the Ark of the Covenant would stand. It was placed between two huge cherubim statues whose wings spread out and overshadowed the

ark. But the temple unlike the tabernacle was made of stone and wood, a permanent house. The entire inside of the temple including the cherubim were covered in gold. Outside the temple was a huge altar for burning sacrifices and a large basin of water for ceremonial washing. Surrounding this courtyard was a wall, so that it looked very much like the tent had.

Solomon spent seven years building the house of God. A great service was held to dedicate the temple, with more offerings than could be counted. The Ark of the Covenant was placed in the Holy of Holies.

Then the glory of the Lord came down in a thick cloud and filled up the temple. It was so thick that

the priests could not do anything in the temple. In this way God showed them he was pleased and promised that he would stay with the people and be their God and hear their prayers.


Then Solomon himself prayed before the Lord a

long time. He asked God to make this temple a house of prayer. When they had sinned he would forgive them and hear their prayers and heal them. He prayed God would hear them no matter what their sin or even if they were carried off as

prisoners to another country. Even if a foreigner came and prayed in the temple, no matter what, God would hear when they prayed to Him and asked for His forgiveness and he would heal them.


Solomon then began building his palace. He spent thirteen years building it, twice the time spent on the temple.

After this the Lord came to Solomon in a dream. "I have heard your prayers," He said. "I will live in the temple. And if you obey Me, as your father did, your family will rule forever. But if you turn from Me, I will leave the temple. Then your enemies will come and destroy this house you built for Me."



1 Kings 10-11 Theme: Putting God First

hile Solomon was king, Israel was a great nation. Solomon was very wise and knew about many things. He wrote three thousand sayings in the Old Testament book of Proverbs, and he wrote more than a thousand songs. He knew about trees and animals, and things other people knew nothing about.

Nobles and kings came from all over the world to visit Solomon and talk to him, bringing many rich gifts every year and giving even their daughters to marry him. One of these visitors was the Queen of Sheba. Her land was 1,000 miles away from Israel. She had heard of wise king this and wanted to see him herself. When she came, she brought Solomon rare and expensive presents and planned to test him with very hard questions. When she



and when the *Queen of Shebe* learned about Solomon, she came to test him with very hard questions. I Kings 10:1

heard Solomon speak and saw all the wealth he had and the offerings he made at the temple she was overwhelmed.

"I didn't think it was true you were this wise and rich but I hadn't heard half of it. How happy your men must be! Praise be to the LORD! In his eternal love for Israel, he has made you king, to maintain justice and righteousness," she said.

1 Kings 10:9

"Praise be to the LORD your God, who has delighted in you and placed you on the throne of Israel. Because of the LORD's eternal love for Israel, he has made you king, to maintain justice and righteousness."

However, Solomon had many wives—over 700 wives of nobility and 300 slave women for having children! Many of them were not Israelites and worshiped idols. To please them, he built several

temples for their idols. He even went there and worshiped the idols himself.

This made God angry with Solomon. For David's sake. God said Solomon's son would rule over one of the tribes of Israel. But the rest of the country would be ruled by one of Solomon's servants because Solomon had disobeyed. Although God had given him peace all his life, God made the king of Edom his enemy, as well.

The servant who would rule over

Solomon's kingdom was named Jeroboam. Solomon tried to have Jeroboam killed, but he escaped into Egypt and stayed there until Solomon died. Solomon was king for forty years. When he died he was buried on Mount Zion. His son Rehoboam became the new king.





> takes both the wise and the fool equally. He realized that all the works that he had done in his life would be given to another after he died who would not care about them. Nothing he did would last or make much difference, so also his works were of no meaning.

In the end he saw that the only meaning in life is God. Everything else is meaningless because man comes from the dust and returns to the dust along with everything he did in his

difficult life. It sounds kind of sad, like Solomon is complaining too much. But actually in his great wisdom and final repentance he accepted the most important truth: all things find meaning in God alone. And when God is the ultimate meaning of our life everything we do has meaning and great purpose. A life of sin is meaningless but a life in God is the most meaningful.

hen Solomon died the people rose up against his son Rehoboam. They complained about the high taxes and heavy work they had to do for the king. Their leader was Jeroboam.

The people told Rehoboam he could be their

king if he lightened the burdens his father had put on them. The wise elders in Rehoboam's palace agreed with the people. If he made their burden lighter the people would love and serve him all his days.

But when Rehoboam asked the young princes around him the same question, he got a very different answer. These were spoiled men who were used to living off the work of others. They said Rehoboam should work the people "Tell harder. even ľm much them,

stronger than my father if he whipped you with whips, I'll whip you with scorpions!" Rehoboam listened to the young men instead of his elders.

When Rehoboam told the people he was going to work them even harder than his father had, the people refused to make him their king. Ten of the twelve tribes broke away and made Jeroboam 1 Kings 12:20

their king. These ten tribes were from the northern part of the country. Their new kingdom was called the kingdom of Israel and its capitol was Shechem and later Samaria.

> Rehoboam was king of the land in the south which was called Judah and its capitol remained Jerusalem. When the other nations nearby saw this happen, they broke away from the rule of Rehoboam too. The Syrians, Ammonites, Moabites, and Edomites all set up their own kings. David had captured all these lands years ago. Now they were lost.

Rehoboam began to gather an army to fight the ten tribes that left him, but God told him not to fight his own

brothers, this was God's doing. As God had foretold to Solomon, the kingdom was torn in half. Ten tribes were given to Solomon's servant and only one tribe was left to be ruled by his son. The divided kingdoms each had their own line of kings and their own history in God from this point on.

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

od told Jeroboam that he should be the king of the ten tribes of the north called Israel. God said, "If you serve God and do what I want, your sons will rule after you."

The people from the north still went to Jerusalem in the southern kingdom to worship God. Jeroboam did not think this was good. He was afraid they would become friends with people

Jeroboam knew he had done wrong. "Please," he said to the prophet, "ask God to make my hand


well."

But Jeroboam did not change his ways; he and his people still worshiped the idols. One day a prophet gave Jeroboam more bad news. "You have led your people against Me," God said through the prophet. "For that, you will be punished. Every one of your children will die. God will have the people of Israel

taken away to a far land because they worshiped idols."

After Jeroboam died and his son Nadab became king, a servant killed Nadab and all the other children of Jeroboam. The kingdom had been taken away from the man who led his country into sin.




> certain town. A woman then would take care of him. When Elijah found the woman she had only a little food and oil for cooking. She and her son were starving too.



or three years no rain fell in Israel. No food could grow and all the animals were dying. King Ahab knew he had to find Elijah and get him to bring the rains back. Ahab sent men to search for him everywhere, and he even asked kings of other countries to look for him. But Elijah could not be found.

In the third year of no rain, Ahab called the chief of his servants to him. Obadiah was a good man who worshiped God and tried to do right, even though he served Ahab. When the time was right, Elijah let Obadiah find him.

Ahab rushed out to meet with Elijah and ask for his help. Elijah told Ahab to bring all his people to Mount Carmel. He was also to bring the 400 prophets who served the idol Baal and the 400 who served the idol Asherah.

When all the people

were gathered together, Elijah told them they had sinned by worshiping idols. Then he gave them a strange order. They were to prepare two sacrifices. One would be for Baal and one for the Lord. Neither of the two fires would be lit. The people could all pray to Baal and ask him to light the fire for his sacrifice. Elijah would ask God to light his fire. <u>1 Kings 18:15</u> "When all the people saw this, they ell prostrate and cried, 'The LORD he is God! The LORD—he is God!""

No matter what the prophets did, Baal's sacrifice would not catch on fire. They screamed out, they rolled on the ground and even cut themselves again and again but nothing happened. Elijah laughed at them. "Try again," he said. "Maybe Baal is asleep.

Maybe he's away on vacation!"

In the middle of the afternoon Elijah told the people to soak the wood under his sacrifice with water. This would make it very hard to light. Three times they poured barrels of water over Elijah's altar until it was soaking wet. Then Elijah stood before the altar and asked God to light the fire and show that He was the true God. Fire fell from the sky and lit the fire and the offering was burned up.

The people fell on their faces and cried, "The

Lord is God!"

Elijah ordered the people to capture all the priests of Baal and kill them because they had led Israel into sin, Then he went up to the top of the mountain and prayed to God for rain. In a little while the sky was covered with clouds and rain fell on the land for the first time in three years.
